# NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$ 0.073120 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Midland County Hospital District

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2023 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Midland County Hospital District from the same properties in both the 2022 tax year and the 2023 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Midland County Hospital District may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Midland County Hospital District is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2023 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 28, 2023 at 11:45 am at Midland Memorial Hospital Admin Board Room; 400 Rosalind Redfern Grover Parkway, Midland TX

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Midland County Hospital District is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Board of Directors of Midland County Hospital District at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.
