Newly Diagnosed with COVID-19? Talk to your Healthcare Provider about a NEW TREATMENT for high-risk patients

MIDLAND HEALTH

- Midland Health has been authorized to provide a new antibody treatment for newly-diagnosed, high-risk COVID-19 patients: Bamlanivimab. This experimental treatment could help prevent hospitalization in highrisk patients.
- The treatment is administered by the hospital staff in a special off-site infusion center.
- In order to qualify for the treatment, the following must be true:
- You have had COVID symptoms in the last 4 days and have tested COVID positive less than 4 days ago.
- You have not been hospitalized for COVID or use more oxygen than before you were diagnosed with COVID.
- One of the following must also be true:
 - You are significantly overweight (Obese, BMI>35)
 - You have chronic kidney disease, diabetes, or an immunosuppressive disease or are receiving immunosuppressive treatments.
 - You are 65 or older <u>AND ALSO HAVE</u> heart disease, high blood pressure, or a chronic respiratory disease, like COPD.

* Final eligibility is determined when screened by hospital provider upon referral

** If eligibility is approved, you will be scheduled regardless of the ability to pay. If available, insurance information will be collected. NO out-of-pocket fees will be required for anyone.
