#### **Sue Dorr**


On May 18,2024 Midland Memorial Foundation received the unfortunate news of the death of Sue Dorr. Sue was born in Chickasha, Oklahoma and attended the University of Oklahoma where she earned a degree in elementary education. It was at OU that she met her husband, John R. Dorr. After they married, Sue and John returned to John's hometown of Pecos, Texas. Sue became a teacher and taught elementary school until she retired to raise her family full time. Sue and John had four children and along with raising them, were both active in the Pecos community. In 2005 John was appointed a Midland Memorial Foundation Honorary Governor, representing Pecos until his passing in 2009. After John's death, Sue replaced him as the Honorary Governor.

Several years later, Sue moved to Midland and was appointed to the Board of Governors in 2017. She established the Sue and John Robert Dorr Endowment Fund in memory John and in honor of her family. Sue was a valuable member of the Board of Governors and always an advocate for Midland Memorial Hospital. Sue will be missed by Midland Memorial Foundation and will be remembered for her energetic and optimistic spirit.

#### **Bob L. Jones**

Midland Memorial Foundation was very sad to hear of the news that our friend, Bob Jones, died August 17, 2024 in Little Rock, Arkansas. Bob proudly served the Midland community for 48 years.

Bob was a dedicated member of the Board of Governors and was active in many civic and community affairs. He attended Arkansas A&M (now the University of Arkansas at Monticello) and later earned his MBA from Texas Christian University. During the Korean War, Bob served as a combat engineer for the U.S. Army. He began his professional career working as a staff accountant for Texaco and years later became the executive vice president of Midland National Bank and First City National Bank.



After retiring from his banking career, Bob spent many years as the executive director of the Fasken Foundation. Bob was also a member of the Rotary Club, Exchange Club and the United Way. He served on the board of directors for the Midland-Odessa Symphony Orchestra, Young Life and the Midland Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees. In 2009 he accepted the appointment to the Board of Governors where he served until 2019, when he and his wife, Virginia, moved to Arkansas to enjoy living back in his home state. Midland Memorial Foundation is grateful for Bob's legacy of service and dedication to our hospital and community.

## **Hope Chest**

Hope Chest is an incentive program for pregnant and parenting women of all ages, incomes, races, religious affiliations, and needs, focusing on the health of babies across the Permian Basin. The program encourages responsibility and healthy behavior during and after pregnancy.

Hope Chest has assisted almost 1,100 moms and babies in our community since 2016. Over the last year, nearly 100 moms have signed up for the program. One way Hope Chest supports expectant mothers by providing a Becoming A Mom course at Coleman



High School for young mothers. The course helps support young mothers with resources, connections, and support during their pregnancy. This program supports and celebrates the mother's journey by empowering them and encouraging healthy behaviors for both mom and baby.

## **Midland Memorial Hospital Auxiliary School Supply Drive**

MMH Auxiliary's annual school supply drive aims to ensure every student is set for a successful year by providing supplies for students in need. When students have the necessary supplies, the impact can be significant. Studies have shown students feel 94% more prepared, their self-confidence increases by 76%, and they participate in class 83% more. The MMH Auxiliary is so incredibly grateful to the Junior Student Volunteers, whom really took the lead on this project. After supplies were delivered to the hospital, volunteers organized supplies by grade, working over the course of a week.

## **Look Good Feel Good Shop**

The Look Good Feel Good Shop is dedicated to improving the appearance, confidence and self-esteem of individuals undergoing cancer treatment. Midland Memorial Foundation is excited to report that the Look Good Feel Good Shop has touched the lives of 86 patients this year! The shop offers complementary wigs, hats and beauty kits to help patients navigate their diagnosis with greater confidence. With a significant increase in new cancer diagnoses every year, the demand for these services is greater than ever. We are grateful for donors who help us fund these important accessories for cancer patients as they undergo treatment.

In its second year of operation, Leslie's Place, a free community clinic that offers primary medical services to uninsured adults in the community, is making a difference! It has served 1,079 patients from September 1, 2023 to August 31, 2024. Leslie's Place is a joint effort by Midland Health and Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center and is staffed by Texas Tech resident physicians. The clinic, housed in the Casa de Amigos building, provides services without an appointment and has an on-site lab and pharmacy, allowing for quick results on basic tests such as flu, covid and more. The pharmacy also helps ensure more patients leave with the medication they need.
