# \$1,033,429

**ANNUAL ENDOWMENT GIFT** provided funding to purchase a Spine Navigation Robot. The spine robot has the capability of expanding current spine surgery treatment options offered at MMH. This provides a great benefit to the residents of our community so they can stay local for treatment.

# \$6,913



Provided to the **Look Good Feel Good Shop**, a service that offers supplies and support to cancer patients free of charge. This funding assisted in providing 136 wigs, 855 turbans and scarves, 113 hats, and 73 specialty skin care products to MMH cancer patients at no charge.

# \$10,000

Provided to support the **Ninja Warrior Obstacle Course** offered to elementary aged children at the 2019 Wellness Tour hosted by Midland Health. The activity was coupled with other activities and education opportunities that teach children about living a health life and making healthy lifestyle choices.

# \$20,000

To support the **Hope Circle Program**, that serves 25-50 patients annually that are currently battling cancer or cancer survivors. The program offers classes in yoga, art therapy, and healthy cooking at no cost to the patients in hopes of improving their quality of life, relieving stress, anxiety, and increasing energy.

# \$7,500

Committed in funding to support Midland Health's **Hope Chest Program**. Hope Chest is an incentives-based program for pregnant and parenting women of all ages, incomes, and backgrounds, focusing on the health of babies across the Permian Basin. Currently, Hope Chest has 650+ clients enrolled in the program, with two to three hundred of these clients being active participants.



# \$10,535

Provided in funding to support a Free Mammography Night hosted by Midland Health's Breast Center. This is a 2.5 hour event that provides lifesaving services to at least 20 patients.

# \$7,500

Provided in funding to support the Lifestyle Medicine Department's Community Health Improvement Initiative. Funds were utilized to pay for patient's CHIP workbooks, Eat to Beat Cancer Workbooks, and lab tests. Each cohort has 30 - 50 patients participating.
