



# Midland lost one of its true unsung heroes, with the passing of our friend Barbara Jowell.

Barbara joined the Midland Memorial Foundation in 1994, and took over as Executive Director in 1996. Prior to her time with MMF, she worked for several years as a political fundraiser. Among her many career accomplishments, she was a founding member of the Permian Basin chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals. She served in a variety of capacities with several area non-profit organizations, including the West Texas Aphasia Center and the Junior league of Midland. Barbara and her friend Donette Schwisow founded Life Strategies and co-authored the book "After He's Gone", sharing their personal experiences and offering counseling and support to newly widowed and divorced women.

When I came to Midland in 2002, Barbara immediately became a vital ally in my new role as CEO. She knew everyone in the community, understood the important relationships and helped to introduce me. In every way, Barbara was the model of southern gentility and grace – the perfect example of the ideal leader of a "friend-raising" (one of Barbara's terms) organization like Midland Memorial Foundation.

I also came to realize that, beneath her polished appearance and gracious hospitality was a steely independence and determination that was every bit as vital to the Foundation's success. Barbara was keenly focused on MMF's long-term prosperity, especially the growth of an endowment that would allow the organization to support healthcare in Midland long after her tenure ended. Growing the Endowment was a singular commitment for her, and I still remember the excitement we all felt when its assets passed the \$10 million mark in 2006. Currently standing at over \$60 million, Midland Memorial Foundation's Endowment is Barbara's greatest legacy.



Barbara played a key role in another monumental achievement, the funding of a new inpatient tower for Midland Memorial Hospital. Barbara worked alongside Rosalind Redfern Grover to run the greatest fundraising campaign in Midland's generous history. The \$67 million raised to help fund the construction of the \$170 million Dorothy and Clarence Scharbauer, Jr. Patient Tower made it possible for Midland to have truly state-of-the-art inpatient facilities to serve its growing population. Without Barbara's dedicated efforts, consistently offered behind the scenes and without regard for personal recognition, the Campaign for Tomorrow simply could not have succeeded. The coronavirus crisis has challenged our community in many ways. At the front line of these challenges has been Midland Memorial Hospital working every day and night to care for those ill by the virus as well as the full range of health care needs for those in our community.

We could not do this work without your support. Gifts to the Midland Memorial Foundation are used to provide the necessary equipment, materials and projects to address our community's critical health care needs. Here are five ideas that are tax-wise as you may consider a gift this year.

- **1. Cash gifts.** We are thankful for all gifts of cash made by check or credit card. For those who will itemize deductions on their tax return for calendar year 2020, there is a new limit for the charitable deduction for cash gifts made in 2020. The CARES Act passed earlier this year allows a charitable deduction limit of 100% of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for all gifts of cash made prior to December 31, 2020! In 2021, the deduction limit for cash gifts returns to a 60% of AGI limit. So, this is an excellent year to make cash gifts, especially to pay off a pledge or a major gift to support Midland Memorial Foundation.
- **2. Universal deduction.** Even if you do not itemize deductions on your tax return, this is still a good year to make a gift! For 2020 only, there is an opportunity for an above-the-line deduction for charitable gifts. This universal deduction is subject to a cap of \$300 total for single and married tax filers.

- **3. Two tax benefits for gifts of appreciated stock.** If you own appreciated stock, you will receive two tax benefits for a gift of stock. First, you will be entitled to an income tax charitable deduction for the value of the stock. Second, you escape any potential capital gains tax that you would owe if you sold the stock instead. Most gifts of stock are easily accomplished by a wire transfer from your account to the Midland Memorial Foundation account. Please contact Nancy Woodman for wire delivery instructions.
- **4. IRA charitable rollovers.** For persons age 70.5 years and older and who own an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you can make a gift from the IRA directly to Midland Memorial Foundation and owe no income tax on the withdrawal! You do not receive a charitable deduction for the gift but the tax avoidance on the withdrawal offers similar tax savings and is available even if you do not itemize deductions on your tax return! The maximum allowed each year is \$100,000 per person which applies separately to a husband and wife who own separate IRAs. Even though required minimum distributions (RMD) now begin at age 72, the IRA charitable rollover is still available at age 70.5 years. Please contact Nancy Woodman for wire or check delivery instructions for IRA charitable rollovers.
- **5. Donor advised fund grants to fulfill pledges.** If you have created a donor advised fund (DAF) with a local community foundation or another third party such as Fidelity or Schwab, you may make grants to Midland Memorial Foundation. And these grants may fulfill multi-year pledges. While you receive a deduction for your gift when made to the DAF and not when the grant is made to Midland Memorial Foundation we will be honored to recognize you for your philanthropy if you wish.
